Draft Written Descriptions for Amendments to the Enrolment Schemes of the four State Primary schools in Rolleston, effective for the 2021 school year.

Note that while documentation refers to these amendments as effective for the 2021 school year, the amendments could be implemented earlier.

Note regarding Transitional Arrangements (Grandparenting):

These arrangements only apply to families of current students who become out-of-zone as a result of zone changes where a zone withdraws / retreats from an area.

In the Draft zones outlined below, there is no retreat area for Lemonwood Grove School in the proposed amendment for the 2021 school year, so no Transitional Arrangements are required.

Most of the retreat areas for the other three schools are areas of current zone overlap or areas of current / future development where few families currently reside.

The following pages outline potential amended Enrolment Schemes for the four primary schools in Rolleston. The potential Home Zone areas described match the maps as prepared for consultation regarding the proposed amendments for the 2021 school year.

Note that for some areas, limited information is available regarding the road layout in new subdivisions. This is particularly the case for West Rolleston and Lemonwood Grove near Jean Archie Drive, for Lemonwood Grove near Fairbairn Road / Charles Major Road, and for Lemonwood Grove and Clearview Primary near the Falcons Landing development.

Further information will become available during the consultation period as development is continuing rapidly in growth areas near boundary roads. This information will be incorporated in the final version of the Written Descriptions, once consultation is complete and amendments are finalised and approved.

Written Descriptions for the Proposed Enrolment Schemes for 2022 will be completed following consultation.

This consultation is regarding the section entitled "Home Zone". All other parts of the written enrolment scheme are pre-defined.

Lemonwood Grove School (6967)

 - Including East Maddisons Road from Fairbairn Road to Ellington Mews
